Security Dynamics Group LLC | Michael Bouchard joined *FFLGuard* in 2011 at its Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) Special Agent Attaché and Liaison to the ATFA, which is the association for former ATF personnel. He currently serves as President of Security Dynamics Group LLC, a professional consulting service. Also, he serves as EOD Technology's Chief Security Officer, with oversight over EODT's domestic and international sites. EODT is a security, critical mission support and munitions response provider for DOD, DOS, and other clients. Prior to assuming this position, he was EODT's Homeland Security Senior Advisor.

Mr. Bouchard offers 25+ years of senior law enforcement experience. In December 2007, he retired from the ATF where he served in a number of key positions such as: Assistant to the Director, Assistant Director Field Operations, Deputy Assistant Director for Strategic Intelligence and Information, Chief of Arson and Explosives Programs and Special Agent in Charge, Resource Management Branch. He held several key field positions such as Special Agent in Charge, Baltimore Field Division.

Throughout his career, Mr. Bouchard supervised several significant incidents for ATF. He supervised ATF's assets at the Pentagon on September 11, 2001, and was one of the three overall incident commanders during the Beltway Sniper investigation. He also supervised ATF's National Response Teams during several events, including the 2002 Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City, Utah.

Prior to joining ATF, Mr. Bouchard was a police officer. He earned a Masters of Science degree in National Security Strategy from the National War College, Washington DC, and a Bachelors of Science degree in Fire and Arson Investigation from the University of New Haven, West Haven, Connecticut. He also attended the "Pinnacle" course for senior flag officers at the National Defense University, Washington DC, and is also a Certified Protection Professional through the American Society for Industrial Security (ASIS).
